Your story counts, no matter where you served during the era.

In the meantime, we need to determine where and how we will participate in the nationally recognized “Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day” on Saturday, March 26. And then there's the annual election of officers and board members of the chapter coming up in April.

So, plan to join us as we have lots to discuss at our next monthly meeting on Wednesday, February 10 at 6pm at the Elks Lodge in Santa Barbara. (The spaghetti dinner served by the Elks is just \$8).

## OUR HUEY NEEDS A NEW HOME

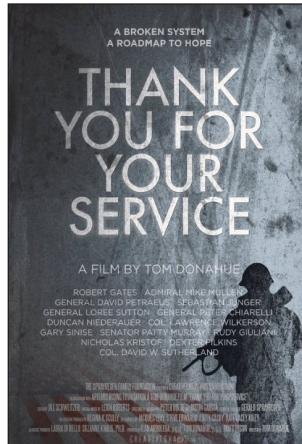

## “THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE” AT THE LOBERO THEATER

As part of the Santa Barbara International Film Festival there is a free screening of the feature length documentary “Thank You for Your Service” on Saturday, February 13th at 2pm at the Lobero Theater, 33 E. Canon Perdido, Santa Barbara. A great number of former military and government leaders share their personal views of regret and lack of preparedness for the homecoming and transition needs of Veterans (and their family members) from the Vietnam War to the present. A 90-minute panel discussion will follow the screening.



There are no advance tickets; all you need do is show up 30 minutes before the event. The sponsors of the film have 400 seats available for Veterans and their family members from Ventura to San Luis Obispo, so pass the word.

A local Iraq Army Combat Veteran, William Rodriguez, is prominently featured in the film and will be at the screening to answer questions. After the panel discussion a free reception will be held at a nearby restaurant (locale to be announced) to allow attendees

to continue the discussion and their reactions to the movie in a more informal setting. **For more info on the film see the attached flyer.**

## AN UNEXPECTED GIFT

At our meeting in January, member and attorney Steve Penner rose to announce that the chapter was being gifted with a check for \$50,000(!) from the estate of the late Mary Staves, a longtime Santa Barbara resident who had a soft spot in her heart for Veterans.
