STATUS OF THE HUEY HELICOPTER

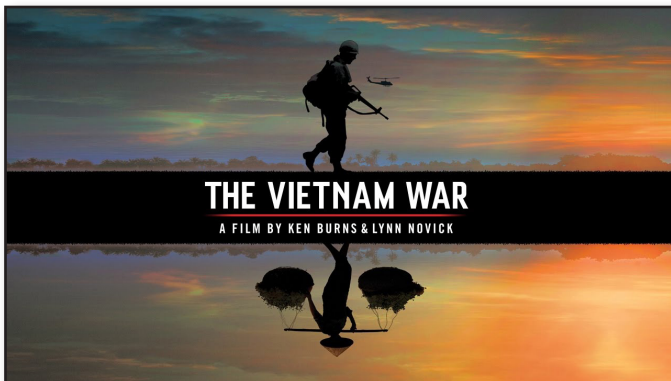
Our beloved Huey, which has been parked at the National Guard Armory on Canon Perdido Street in Santa Barbara for over 10 years, is now situated at 6444 Hollister Avenue (behind Santa Barbara Motorsports) in a large, fenced and gated lot. It was necessary to relocate the bird because the SB School District is moving ahead with the purchase of the armory property and intends to build a new stadium on the site. This new location has been offered to us at no cost! Kudos to members George Ogle and Matt Thomas for their untiring efforts to relocate the bird!



In the meantime, our chapter had to pay for the cleanup and landscaping around the entire armory property as part of the new agreement we signed last November with the State and the Guard. The final tally for the work came to over \$6,000, but if prorated out over ten years it works out to \$50 per month. (Keep in mind that the NG and the State had never previously charged us for all the time we were on the property).

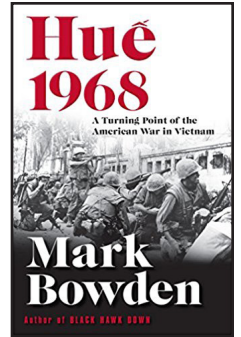
“THE VIETNAM WAR” PBS-TV SERIES STARTS SEPT. 17

RECOMMENDED READING

“HUE 1968: A Turning Point of the American War in Vietnam” by Mark Bowden

The timing of the publication of this book couldn't have come at a better time, what with the debut of “The Vietnam War” series on PBS in September and the 50th Anniversary of the Tet Offensive in late January, 2018. Bowden's focus is on just one major battle of that long war and delves deep into the memories of the many Americans (military and civilian), South Vietnamese, North Vietnamese and Viet Cong cadre (men and women) who were a part of it.



Hue, the old capital of Vietnam, was the target of a takeover by North Vietnamese and Viet Cong forces at the start of the Tet Offensive (January 31, 1968) and soon became a vast killing field that lasted for nearly 30 days and leaving thousands of civilians dead and heavy losses sustained by American, South Vietnamese and NVA forces. But the point had been made: That North Vietnam's resolve had not been weakened by the years of warfare and it was determined to show that it could do damage all across the South, including the cities that were once deemed “safe” from the ravages of the war. It is riveting reading, indeed. (Bowden is the author of “Black Hawk Down”).
