Greetings to the Membership:

It has been a busy time for the chapter, especially with our Huey helicopter on display at several events over the past month or so. At the State Street Nationals Car Show on May 15 we received over \$700 in donations; gear heads love choppers! At the Santa Ynez Valley Airport Day on May 21 we had a lot of excited visitors—young and old—as our team talked up The Moving Wall display in October. My thanks to everyone who staffs the bird and gets her to and from the Armory.

The Huey was also on view May 31 at San Marcos High School. It was impressive to see nearly 1,000 students in the stands as we ran through a solemn ceremony, highlighted by the “Missing Man” table, the story behind the black POW-MIA flag and a flag folding presentation. San Marcos was the first site in the entire country to have a plaque dedicated to the memory of 38 former students of area high schools who were killed in ‘Nam. I believe it’s vital that the younger generation understand the meaning behind these symbols and ceremonies and why it’s important for them to continue these traditions long after you and I are gone.

There are two events coming up that may hold interest for a lot of you: Author (“War”, “The Perfect Storm”) and documentarian (“Restrepo”) Sebastian Junger appears at the Santa Barbara Channel City Club luncheon on Wednesday, June 8 to discuss his latest book, “Tribe: On Homecoming and Belonging”, a deep look into the need for families, friends, communities and the country to uphold and nurture those returning from war. On Saturday, June 11 at 7pm, Pulitzer Prize-winning photographer Nick Ut will be at the Ojai Art Center Theater at 7pm with a slideshow of his photographs, followed by a Q&A. Ut’s 1972 photo of nine-year-old Kim Phuc running naked along a South Vietnamese road following a botched napalm attack (by South Vietnamese planes) went worldwide and marked another turning point in the war. Phuc survived her burns and the two are good friends to this day. Tickets are \$35 and available at www.ojaiartcenter.org or by calling (805) 646-0117.
