2013 was a successful year for our chapter, now having grown to over 100 members. We participated in a number of events that put us at the center of public attention and I can't thank enough all of you who participated in so many different ways to help fly the colors.

Our helicopter continues to draw gawking and curious crowds who want to take pictures and ask, "What was it like to fly in this thing?" or "What was it like in 'Nam?" Moreover, they are truly interested in the first hand stories told by our members, irrespective of whether they served in-country, on the sea or in the air or were "ground pounders", pilots, door gunners, chaplain's assistants, cooks, weapons specialists, artillery spotters, clerks, tank drivers, medics, etc.

With that in mind, it is my hope and vision that over the next two years we will—as a chapter—bring to the forefront what Vietnam meant then and how it has remained as a touchstone for our lives and for our country as a whole. Our sights are set are bringing The Moving Wall back to Santa Barbara in the latter part of 2015 as a highlight of the national VVA rollout of marking the 50th and 40th year anniversaries of the war. (1965: the year our intensive combat operations began; 1975: the fall of Saigon and the official end to the war).

Thank you for your support of the chapter, and to all who helped make our events—from Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day (another one coming up at the end of March) to Fiesta, from Memorial Day Ceremonies to Rods and Roses, from July 4th to Veterans Day, from the Big Read program in conjunction with the Santa Barbara Library System to the Military Ball with Karl Marlantes—and everything else in between—so successful!

My grateful thanks also to the many who gave of their time—especially our officers and board members—and to those who provided financial support to the chapter; without which we would not be the organization we are today.

I look forward to this year as being one of continued growth in membership and fellowship as our bond of a shared experience of a time long ago and a place far away brings us even closer together.

during the past year.

Please continue to donate any of the above items and bring them to our monthly Chapter meetings. If you have clothing items and are unable to attend, please drop off to Charlie "Crash" Huff, Executive Director of the VMB during business hours. He will contact me and I'll take it from there. Just make sure my name is on the box or bag of the items you are donating.

In the New Year, we will be implementing an improved donation system through Officer Craig Burleigh of the SBPD. He has been taking care of 35 HOMELESS VETERANS who are currently living on the streets of Santa Barbara. Our future donations will be directed to them through Officer Burleigh.

In addition to being a member of the SBPD for 15 years, Officer Burleigh is the Restorative Policing Officer, Tactical Patrol Force, Hostage Team Leader, and Veterans Treatment Court Representative.

County Opts to Manage the Veterans Memorial Building

The Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors voted 5-0 on December 3, 2013 to have the County take over management of the Veterans Memorial Building effective at the end of April, 2014.

This means that the Veterans Coordinating Council, which had oversight of the building for many years, will no longer manage the day-to-day affairs of the VMB and no longer be responsible for its fiscal needs and upkeep.



However, nothing changes as far as the relationship with Veterans groups who use the building (whether free or otherwise); nor any other organizations or private parties who wish to rent the building's offices, kitchen or auditorium.

And the VCC will continue as a body of Veterans groups whose desire to work more closely with Veterans of all eras and address the needs of those vets.

Chapter 218 member John Selfridge has replaced Dennis Hartman as our representative to the VCC and will be attending the monthly meetings on the last Wednesday of each month at 12noon, which are always open to the public. (Next meeting: Jan 29).
