Our deadline is May 1 to provide a check to the Santa Barbara Scholarship Foundation which is turn hands out the awards to qualified applicants.

WANTED: ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR


The Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care of Santa Barbara seeks the following: An honorably discharged member of the U.S. Armed Forces to be the Administrative Coordinator of Volunteer Services, a per diem position at 10 hours per week.

This position provides clerical support and coordination assistance for the volunteer program. The Administrative Coordinator demonstrates respect and promotes the mission, values and vision of Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care.

Among the essential duties and responsibilities this position supports the overall management of volunteer support throughout the agency with a focus on North County and the We Honor Vets program. Recruits, trains, and supports volunteers in North County and works with all volunteers. Tracks, inputs and logs data from volunteer visits and monthly progress reports into Allscripts. Assists with patient referrals for volunteers as needed. Oversees progress with the We Honor Veterans program, arranging for Vet to Vet volunteers, patient pinnings, and representation of the agency at Veteran specific collaborative meetings.
